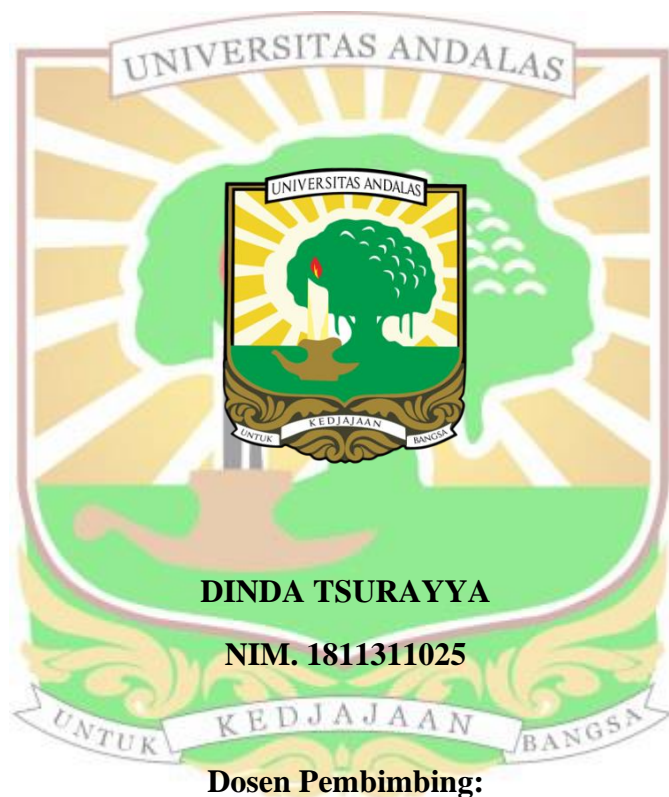

Hubungan Persepsi Lansia Mengenai Vaksin COVID-19 dengan Tingkat Kecemasan Akan Vaksinasi COVID-19 di Wilayah Kerja Puskesmas Pauh Kota Padang Tahun 2022

ABSTRAK

Rendahnya capaian vaksin COVID-19 bagi lansia di Puskesmas Pauh salah satunya disebabkan oleh kekhawatiran lansia dengan beredarnya informasi yang salah mengenai efek samping yang ditimbulkan setelah dilakukannya vaksinasi COVID-19. Hal tersebut menyebabkan lansia tidak mau divaksin COVID-19, karena persepsi yang ditimbulkan mengenai vaksin COVID-19 berbeda-beda. Tujuan penelitian ini adalah untuk mengetahui hubungan persepsi lansia mengenai vaksin COVID-19 dengan tingkat kecemasan akan vaksinasi COVID-19 di wilayah kerja Puskesmas Pauh Kota Padang tahun 2022. Desain penelitian ini adalah penelitian deskriptif analitik dengan pendekatan *cross sectional*. Teknik pengambilan sampel menggunakan teknik *non probability sampling* secara *purposive sampling* dengan jumlah sampel sebanyak 354 lansia. Pengambilan data menggunakan kuesioner persepsi mengenai vaksin COVID-19 dan kuesioner kecemasan *Generalized Anxiety Disorder* (GAD-7). Hasil penelitian didapatkan sebagian besar lansia memiliki persepsi positif terhadap vaksin (58,5%) dan sebagian besar lansia memiliki tingkat kecemasan ringan akan vaksinasi COVID-19 (55,6%). Terdapat hubungan persepsi mengenai vaksin COVID-19 dengan tingkat kecemasan akan vaksinasi COVID-19 dengan *p value* $0,000 < 0,05$. Diharapkan lansia mendapatkan informasi dan edukasi terkait vaksin COVID-19 dan kepada petugas kesehatan dapat mengoptimalkan memberikan penyuluhan dalam meningkatkan penerimaan lansia akan vaksinasi COVID-19.

The Relationship of Elderly Perception Regarding the COVID-19 Vaccine with Anxiety Levels about COVID-19 Vaccination in the Work Area of the Pauh Health Center, Padang City in 2022

ABSTRACT

One of the reasons for the low achievement of the COVID-19 vaccine for the elderly at the Pauh Health Center is the concern of the elderly, with the circulation of incorrect information regarding the side effects caused after the COVID-19 vaccination. This causes the elderly to not want to be vaccinated against COVID-19, because the perceptions generated about the COVID-19 vaccine are different. The purpose of this study was to determine the relationship between the elderly's perception of the COVID-19 vaccine and the level of anxiety about COVID-19 vaccination in the work area of the Pauh Health Center, Padang City in 2022. The design of this research is descriptive analytic research with cross sectional approach. The sampling technique used was non-probability sampling by purposive sampling with a total sample of 354 elderly people. Data collection used a perception questionnaire regarding the COVID-19 vaccine and a Generalized Anxiety Disorder (GAD-7) anxiety questionnaire. The results showed that most of the elderly had a positive perception of the vaccine (58.5%) and most of the elderly had a mild level of anxiety about the COVID-19 vaccination (55.6%). There is a relationship between perceptions of the COVID-19 vaccine and the level of anxiety about COVID-19 vaccination with p value $0.000 < 0.05$. It is hoped that the elderly will receive information and education related to the COVID-19 vaccine and that health workers can optimize providing counseling in increasing the elderly's acceptance of COVID-19 vaccination.
