**ABSTRAK**

**Tujuan Penelitian**

Menurunnya partisipasi ibu PUS dalam program KB merupakan masalah yang perlu diperhatikan, terutama pada masa pandemi COVID-19. Penelitian bertujuan untuk mengetahui faktor-faktor yang berhubungan dengan partisipasi ibu PUS dalam program KB pada masa pandemi COVID-19 di Kelurahan Pisang Kota Padang.

**Metode**

Penelitian kuantitatif dengan desain *Cross Sectional*. Sampel penelitian sebanyak 87 orang. Teknik pengambilan sampel *Proportional Random Sampling*. Analisis data dilakukan secara univariat, bivariat (*chi-square*), dan multivariat (regresi logistik).

**Hasil**

Sebanyak 55,2% ibu PUS berpartisipasi dalam program KB. Terdapat adanya hubungan yang bermakna antara pendidikan ( $p\text{-value}=0,042$ ), pengetahuan ( $p\text{-value}=0,018$ ), sikap ( $p\text{-value}=0,04$ ), ketersediaan alat kontrasepsi ( $p\text{-value}=0,031$ ), aksesibilitas alat kontrasepsi ( $p\text{-value}=0,006$ ) dan dukungan pasangan ( $p\text{-value}=0,008$ ) dengan partisipasi ibu PUS dalam program KB pada masa COVID-19.

**Kesimpulan**

Variabel sikap merupakan faktor paling dominan yang berhubungan dengan partisipasi ibu PUS dalam program KB pada masa pandemi COVID-19. Harapan kepada ibu PUS agar terus berpartisipasi dalam program KB, terus memperhatikan informasi terkait KB agar terbentuknya sikap yang mendukung bagi ibu PUS terhadap adanya program KB.

**ABSTRACT**

**Objective**

The reduced participation mothers of reproductive age in Family Planning programs is a problem that needs attention, especially during COVID-19. The study aims to determine the variable influences reproductive age couples in the program during the COVID-19 in Pisang Village, Padang City.

**Method**

This research used quantitative study with cross-sectional design. The Data were collected from up to 87 samples. The sampling technique uses Proportional Random Sampling. Data analysis was carried out using univariate, bivariate (chi-square), multivariate (logistic regression) methods.

**Result**

The results of the analysis showed that 55.2% mothers of reproductive age participated in the Family Planning program. There is a significant relationship between education (p-value=0.042), knowledge (p-value=0.018), attitude (p-value=0.04), availability of contraceptives (p-value=0.031), accessibility of contraceptives (p-value=0.006) and partner support (p-value=0.008) with the participation of mothers of reproductive age participated in the program during the COVID-19.

**Conclusion**

The most important predictor influencing whether mothers of reproductive age participated in Family Planning programs during COVID-19 is the attitude variable. This study desired that mothers of reproductive age would continue to take part in the program and pay attention to the program-related material so that women of reproductive age have a positive attitude toward the family planning program.
