

CHAPTER IV

CONCLUSION

4.1 Conclusion

In this current study, the writer is concerned with the impoliteness strategies and the functions of impoliteness strategies found in The Ellen Show. The writer presents the data analysis of this research that consists of the conversation between host and guest in The Ellen Show that contains impoliteness strategies. The writer used Culpeper's theory (1996) to analyze the types of impoliteness strategies. Moreover, the writer used Leech's theory (1983) to analyze the context of the meaning of each utterance. As a result, 20 data were collected from nine sample videos and three guests categories from famous host talk show such as Trevor Noah, Jimmy Kimmel and Steve Harvey.

According to this research, there four impoliteness strategies that are found. They are bald on record, negative impoliteness, positive impoliteness and Mock Politeness or Sarcasm. The dominant type of impoliteness strategies is positive impoliteness with 11 data were collected. Meanwhile, negative impoliteness found with 6 data were collected. Mock politeness or sarcasm found with 2 data were collected. Thus, bald on record with 1 data were collected. As a result, the writer can not found the withhold politeness in this research.

Moreover, the writer used Culpeper's theory (2011) to analyze the function of impoliteness strategies found in Ellen and the guest's utterances in The Ellen Show. There are 3 functions of impoliteness strategies that found in this research. The most dominant function is entertaining impoliteness with 14 data

were collected. It occurs because both Ellen or guests used impoliteness strategies to entertain the others. Then, coercive impoliteness appear with 4 data were collected. The last one is affective impoliteness with 2 data were collected.

4.2 Limitation

The limitation of this study was that the writer was unable to identify any type of impoliteness strategies. Furthermore, the withhold impoliteness types are not detected in this study. In completing this research, the writer concentrated only on the forms and purposes of impoliteness methods identified in The Ellen Show, which selected ten videos categorized from the three popular talk show presenters. Furthermore, the writer applied Culpeper's (1996) and (2011) theories to define the types and functions of impoliteness strategies, as well as Leech's (1983) theory to identify the data context.
