## **CHAPTER 4**

## CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

## 4.1 Conclusion

Over the world, there are a lot of languages that are used by people in each country. Related to that, there are a lot of people who use code-switching in their utterances, especially celebrities. This research is about the use of code-switching by celebrities on Podcast in Indonesia. It discusses the use of code-switching by Sophia Latjuba in Deddy Corbuzier's Podcast and aims to analyze the type of code-switching and the reason for using code-switching. The theory by Poplack of the types of code-switching and the theory by Hoffman of the reasons for code-switching were used to conduct the research.

The researcher chose a total of thirty Datums to analyze the types and reasons of code-switching used by Sophia Latjuba. According to Poplack, there are three types of code-switching, namely tag switching, inter-sentential switching, and intrasentential switching. In this research, the three types of code-switching were found in Sophia Latjuba's utterances. From the total of thirty Datum that were analyzed, there are seventeen inter-sentential switchings, seven intra-sentential switchings and six tag switchings found in the research.

Hoffman theory of code-switching implied that there are six reasons why people choose to use code-switching. From those six reasons that encourage people to use code-switching, there are four reasons found in Sophia's utterances, which are talking about a particular topic, repetition, quotation, and interjection. In her

utterances, the researcher found that there are nineteen switchings that talk about particular topic, four repetition switchings, one quotation switching, and 6 interjection switchings. Thus, it can be concluded that the most common type used is the inter-sentential and the most dominant reason found in the research is talking about a particular topic.

## 4.2 Suggestion

This research analyzed the code-switching used by Sophia Latjuba in her utterances. After describing the findings and discussions in this study, this research is expected to be used as a reference for people who are interested in learning and conducting research on code-switching. The writer realizes that this research is still far from perfection. The researcher's analysis in this research is limited to the types of code-switching according to Poplack (1980) and the reason why people use code-switching according to Hoffman (1991). However, if possible, it is hoped that future researchers can conduct research on code switching and use new data sources from other events or platforms.
