CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background of the Research

The Force Unleashed is a Star Wars Legends novel written by Sean Williams. Sean Llewellyn Williams was born on 23 May 1967. He is a New York Times bestselling science fiction author who lives in South Australia. He has co-written three books in Star Wars. One of his novelizations is *Star Wars: The Force Unleashed* was the first novelization of a computer game to debut at #1 on the "New York Times" bestseller list.

The central figure in The Force Unleashed is Starkiller. He was a Jedi's Child who was taken by the Sith Lord Darth Vader as his secret apprentice and personal assassin during the reign of the Galactic Empire. Starkiller believes it is his destiny to help Vader overthrow Sidious and take his throne as Galactic Emperor. He has forgotten everything about his name, his parents, and his home.

I seek to analyze the representation of Starkiller's Psychological Conflict of Good and Evil in Star Wars: The Force Unleashed. With this research, I want to explain the mental issue in the main character that affects his whole life. Thus, I title this research Starkiller's Psychological Conflict of Good and Evil as Seen in Sean Williams's Star Wars: The Force Unleashed.
