CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS

5.1. Conclusion

5.2. Suggestions

- 3. For future research, compare and contrast various film adaptations of the same source material to see how special features change. By showing how several versions address and modify the original story, this method may highlight structure and innovations in the adaptation process.
