CHAPTER IV

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

4.1 Conclusion

This study analyzes the impoliteness strategies used by Jimmy and his guests on the Jimmy Kimmel Live talk show. The writer employed Leech's (1983) theory to examine the context of each utterance's meaning and Culpeper's (1996) theory to examine the various forms of impoliteness strategies. Following the investigation, the writer discovered 25 data points that included impoliteness strategies. These were gathered from 14 sample videos and three guest categories featuring well-known guest stars like Wanda Skyes, Bill Burr, and Trevor Noah.

Five impoliteness strategies are found in this study. These include bald on record, positive impoliteness, negative impoliteness, sarcasm or mock politeness, and withhold politeness. Sarcasm or mock politeness emerged with 12 data points gathered as the most common kind of impoliteness tactics. It occurs due to Jimmy's hosting style, which is characterized by his straightforward and sometimes sarcastic sense of humor. Additionally, the guest is a comedian who employs these strategies as organic extensions of their humorous personas, enabling them to engage in lighthearted yet clever banter. In addition, there are 2 instances of bald on record, 7 instances of positive impoliteness, 3 instances of negative impoliteness, and 1 instance of withold politeness. Furthermore, the writer employed Culpeper's (2011) theory to examine how Jimmy's and the guest's utterances on Jimmy Kimmel Live functioned as impoliteness strategies.

The most dominant function is entertaining impoliteness, with 14 data points collected.

This type of impoliteness occurs when either Jimmy or the guest employs impoliteness

strategies to amuse the audience. Then, affective impoliteness appeared with 10 data were collected. The last one is coercive impoliteness, with 1 data were collected.

4.2 Limitation

The limitation of this research is that it only looks at a few episodes and particular guests, Wanda Skyes, Bill Burr, and Trevor Noah from Jimmy Kimmel Live, which may not accurately reflect the variety of impoliteness strategies employed in other episodes or with guests of all kinds. Then, the writer focused exclusively on the types and purposes of impoliteness strategies seen in The Jimmy Kimmel Live talk show, which included ten videos from three well-known talk show guests. The next writer may also look at other topics or guest-star on Jimmy Kimmel's Live talk show.
