CHAPTER 4

CONCLUSION AND SUGESTION

4.1 Conclusion

In this research, the writer analyzes the forms of slang, identify the types of slang in Chris Brown's songs, and explain the function of the use of slang in the songs. The types of slang are analyzed by using Eric Partridge's (1954) theory and the social function is analyzed by employing Yanchung and Yanhong's (2013) theory. The meaning of the slang words is given by referring to Oxford dictionary, Urban Dictionary, and Dictionary of American slang and Colloquial Expressions in order to help the reader have a better understanding about the slang.

The result of the analysis shows that there are so many words in these selected songs that carry different meaning with its literal one and belongs to specific group of people, thus can be considered as slang. Based on 24 datas, Most of the slangs found in Chris Brown 5 selected songs can be categorized as Society Slang with a total of 83,33% if we refer to Partridge theory. The second most frequent type of slang is Public House slang with a total of 12,5%, and the least frequent one is Medical Slang with a total of 4,16%. The social function of the slang use is mainly emotive feeling, and identity pursuit, if we refer to Yanchun and Yanhong theory.

4.2 Suggestion

From this study, the researcher suggests that slang can be one of the topics for research study in the future especially for the English student and expects that the study will be useful for references. By providing examples of data and analysis from the lyrics of Chris Brown's songs, this research will be beneficial for those who are

developing researches related to slang word for the further researcher who are interested in conducting similar research studies in types, meanings, and social functions of slang can use this as a reference but with different object of study.

After finishing this research, the researcher hopes that further research will be able to develop theories and use more complex data by looking at several other related studies as a reference, and the development of this study is needed for the better study.
