CHAPTER IV

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

This chapter consists of a brief conclusion and suggestion of this research.

4.1 Conclusion

From the analysis of the illocutionary force behind the status of Mark Manson's tweet on his Twitter, the researcher found three types of illocutionary force indicating devices. Those types are performative verbs, stress, and intonation. The most dominant illocutionary force indicating devices used by Mark Manson in his tweet is intonation. He tends to use intonation because he wants to make the viewer get the point for the means by his tweets. On another side, he also wants to describe his attitude in demonstrating something through intonation. So then, the message can be delivered well.

Then, the second research problem is about the intention that Mark Manson used in each of his tweets on his Twitter. There are six types of intention found in this research. Those types are the face of creativity, the face of kindnesses, the face of beauty, the face of expansion, and the face of receptivity. The most frequent intention used is the face of expansion. This intention mostly occurs because one reason is Mark Manson as the self-help author who has a big influence on people in self-development and life. The function of the face of expansion is to lead people to a better version, and self-improvement. Thus, he used the types of intention to influence people to reach the point and do it in life.

4.2 Suggestion

This study not only identifies the types of Illocutionary Force Indicating Devices (IFIDs) in Mark Manson's tweet but also provides an overview of the intention on it. Moreover, the occurrence is shown to find out which type is the most dominant in Mark Manson's tweets. Even so, several types were not found in this study, it turns out that one language features can be investigated further, such as idioms.

After this research, the researcher hopes that people out there, especially as readers, can investigate the Illocutionary Force by seeing the Illocutionary Force Indicating Devices (IFIDs) out the meaning and the intention of other people's utterances exactly in the form of writing so that they can understand well and reduce misinterpretation.
